Commercial cover from Kalimpong, India, sent to Lhasa via Pharijong, where internal postage was applied.

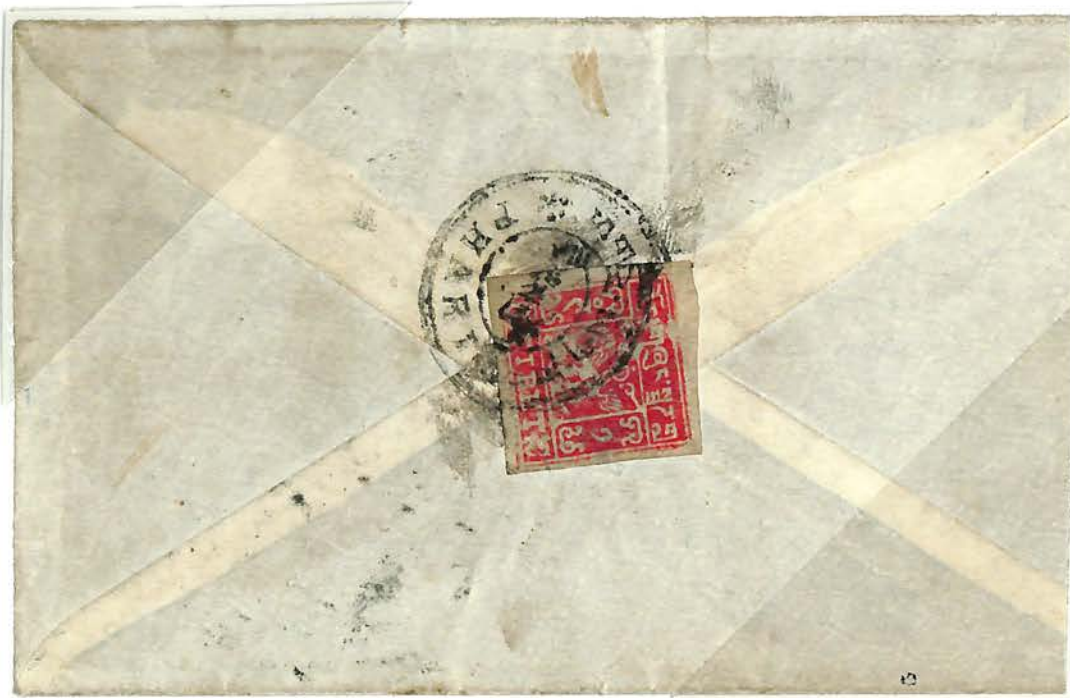

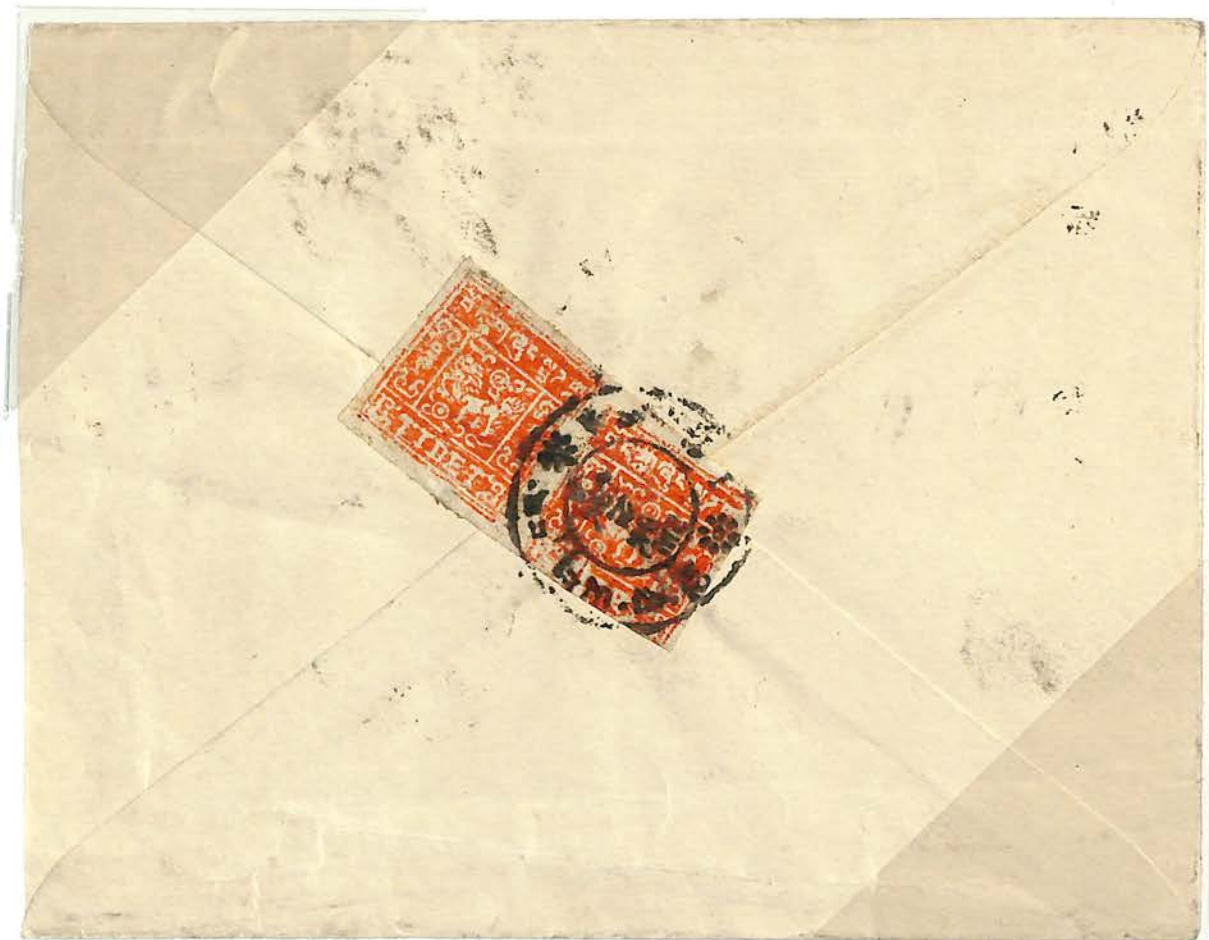


Third setting, orange-red, cliches 5,6 in pair to make the 2 trangka registered rate from Lhasa to Shigatse.

Third setting, reddish vermilion, clichés 11,12, 1948-1953, Phari

2 Trangkas



Registered and insured letter with second setting pair, clichés 9,6 plus bisected 2-trangka to meet the scarce 5-trangka rate, tied with Gyantse cancels.



Registered cover with second setting pair, clichés 9,6, rose, tied with small town cancel of Chushu.

2 Trangkas



First setting, carmine red, cliches 3,4, native Dechen strike

2 Trangkas



First setting, brick red, cliches 5/6, Gyantse to Lhasa with scarce hand-dated receiving mark at Lhasa, registered letter rate.



Second setting, scarlet, cliché 9, on linen surfaced paper resulting in splotchy print. Nagartse cancel.

2 Trangkas

The 2 trangkas value is the second most commonly used stamp of the Third Issue after the 4 trangkas. It was typically used in pairs to meet the 4 trangkas registered letter rate.



First setting, scarlet vermilion, cliches 2,6, c. 1946, Shigatse to Lhasa



Second setting, orange brown, cliches 7,1, 1949-1950, Phari

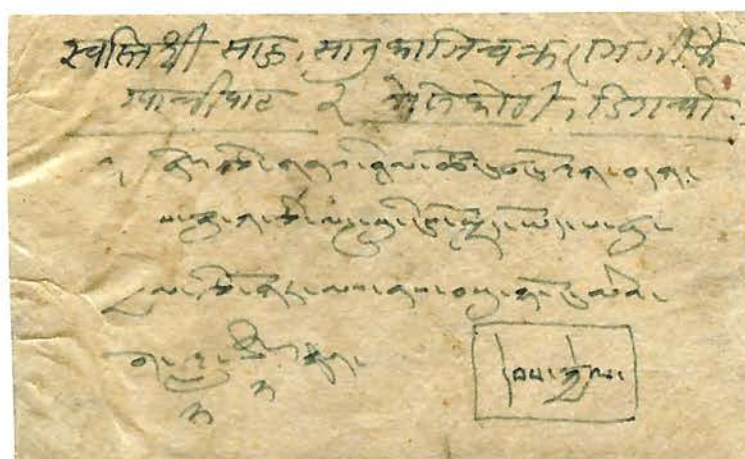
1 and 2 Trangkas



1 trangka orange, cliché 3 and 2 trangkas yellow orange, cliché 12



Second setting, deep scarlet (rough printing), cliches 12/2, registered, mailed at Gyantse.



2 Trangkas



Second setting, dull orange, cliches 11/4, Lhasa to Pharijong, then 2 annas India stamp added for forwarding to Kalimpong.



Second setting, dull scarlet, cliches 12/5/7, Shigatse strike, registered.

4 Trangkas



Emerald, cliché 4, cancelled Phari. This cliché was lost in 1937.

The 4 trangka stamp paid the registered letter rate.



Sage green, cliché 12, Shigatse strike.



Emerald, cliché 12, trader's flag symbol, 1947



Dull green, cliché 9, 1952

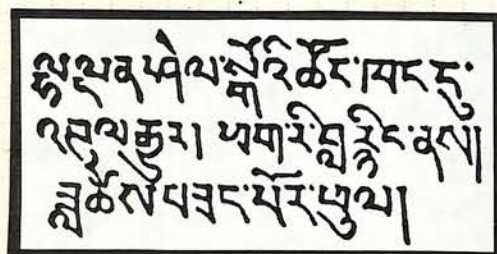

4 Trangkas with 2 Trangkas Bisect



1953 registered cover with 4 trangkas pale yellow green and horizontally bisected 2 trangkas tied with Gyantse strikes. The registered letter rate was now 5 trangkas. Due to a shortage of 1 trangka stamps, the 2 trangkas was bisected.



Second setting, green, cliché 5 on late usage combination cover from Lhasa to Kalimpong, India via Pharijong. The 4 trangkas was cancelled at Lhasa, the point of origin. At Pharijong, the Indian 2 annas was added and tied with the Pharijong-Darjeeling cancel to pay carriage to Kalimpong. Partial Kalimpong arrival mark, 1955.
